Saint Joseph's Oratory of Mount Royal is the outcome of a public enthusiasm that has never waned throughout the years. From the early stages of its construction, Brother André encouraged the Oratory's pilgrims to support this project, which began with very limited funds. His loyal friends eagerly rose to the challenge. It was thanks to these benefactors' remarkable generosity that the project was able to move forward!

But in 1931, the impacts of the Great Depression began to take their toll. The coffers were empty. And yet the desire to continue with building the Basilica never wavered. In June of that year, the rector made an urgent appeal: "If everyone were to share whatever little extra they might have, the project would soon be completed and new blessings would spread across our nation." The December issue of the French Annals of Saint Joseph included an encouraging message: "Thanks to the donations received, and in anticipation of those to come in soon, this year we have been able to set out to work as never before." Noting that the Oratory is God's work, the message went on: "Alms are the oil without which the wheels of construction cannot be set in motion."

Benefactors were encouraged to purchase a stone for the Basilica as a way of encouraging donations. "Who cannot afford a stone? They come in all sizes and costs, from just a few dollars up to hundreds of dollars." Every donor received a certificate indicating "their" stone's location.

Our Reaching New Heights fundraising campaign is based on this beautiful tradition of generosity. Thanks to your support, we are proud that Saint Joseph's Oratory can continue to develop and adapt to the needs of today's visitors. Thank you a million times over!

Under a copper roof

In 1941, the dome of the Basilica, the four turret roofs, as well as the roofs over the nave, the transepts and the aisles, were covered with sheets of copper. That year's November issue of the *Annals of Saint Joseph* reported: "With the amount of copper used, we could have made a ribbon the width of two fingers that was long enough to circle the Earth." Hardly a trifling amount! To help finance the purchase of the material, the Oratory solicited the public's support in the amount of \$50,000.



"Every square foot of copper will have its owner. We are leaving it up to you to put a roof over the dome," reported the *Annals*. For every square foot of copper purchased at a cost of one dollar, a small plaque cut from the copper's trimmings was to be sent to the donor as a keepsake. Each plaque bears the year (1941) and features an image of the Oratory's dome. After being exposed to the wind and the elements, the original copper roofing had to be replaced; the work took place from 2005 to 2010.



The Oratory's donation boxes

These were found in a number of businesses and public areas throughout Montréal, Joliette, Saint-Jérôme and Valleyfield, and perhaps even in your local convenience store.

For more than 70 years, Saint Joseph's Oratory of Mount Royal's donation boxes collected a considerable amount of loose change! Placed next to the cash registers, the boxes urged customers to drop in a few coins to benefit the Oratory. This method of soliciting funds helped pay for the construction of the Basilica, which spanned four decades. And even after the construction was finished, the money boxes continued to raise funds to support Brother André's work. The older boxes made of metal and their wooden stands bore the inscription, "To Saint Joseph for his Basilica." The more recent boxes that were used until 2013 were made of moulded plastic in the shape of the Saint Joseph's Oratory Basilica.

A STEP IN YOUR NAME

In light of the significant cost for every category of step, the amount can be paid over a period of five years. Tax receipts will be issued.

The three categories of interior steps leading to the summit are indicated in different colours on the graph on this page:

Green: **\$2,500** steps between the Museum and the Observation gallery


Blue: **\$5,000** steps

between the oculus and the highest steps

Red: **\$25,000** steps leading to the Observatory in the lantern

The funds received from the sale of the steps will be added to those collected through the *Reaching New Heights* campaign, which is aiming to raise \$15 million. We're almost there! We just need your help to reach the last few steps.

An unwavering support




